

## Benefits of a Dedicated Early Childhood Program

## Some of the learning benefits for students in a dedicated facility for early education include:

- Learning can be easily tailored to each child based upon their needs and readiness.
- Children will be highly engaged through different learning approaches including blended learning, project based learning, flexible grouping, and the ability to use their learning in creative ways.
- The reconfiguration will support our efforts in meeting the expectations of the 3rd Grade Reading Law (PA 306 of 2016, HB 4822).
- Class sizes can be "leveled" creating similar teacher to student ratios between classrooms, creating similar learning environments for all like aged students.

#### Emotional benefits for students in a focused early education program include:

- Children will benefit from being with children their own age that are also transitioning to a new early educational experience at school.
- There will be a building-wide emphasis on providing a safe and positive school environment and culture that supports the intentional early on development of healthy and trusting relationships.
- Classroom and school wide lessons will be provided to assist children with dealing with healthy choices, stress, trauma, and empathy.
- There will be an intentional focus on building positive relationships with families and providing experiences to share resources and empower families in helping their child be successful.

### Some of the social benefits may include:

- Through building-wide consistent, "age-appropriate" character education lessons, all children will be learning and practicing similar social skills at the same time.
- Common and consistent foundational social skills can be developed around social norms (making friends, playground behavior expectations, conflict resolution, problem solving, etc.)

# In addition, several other positive outcomes will be experienced in an early elementary setting such as:

- Educator collaboration through true Professional Learning Communities.
- Focused vision, mission, and goals for an entire building with focus on early education.
- Greater opportunities for flexible and targeted interventions.
- Families will be able to share in very similar experiences related specifically to transitioning to school.
