Assessment Types:

- Summative Measure what students know and are able to do at the end of an instructional period
- Interim Provide real-time information about a student's continuum of learning and growth trajectory
- o Formative Assessment for learning

Types of Performance Assessed:

Proficiency:

- Measure of whether a student has demonstrated a pre-set level of mastery of specific content
- Criterion-Referenced cut score
 - Examples:
 - M-STEP
 - Advanced Placement exam
 - Classroom exams
- Reported as:
 - Levels of proficiency based upon a cut score

Achievement:

- Measure of how much a student knows of a range of content
- Norm Referenced
 - Examples:
 - NWEA
 - PSAT
 - SAT
 - WorkKeys
 - WIDA
- Reported as:
 - Scaled Score
 - o Percentile Ranking

Growth:

- Difference in academic achievement between two points
 - Examples:
 - M-STEP Student Growth Percentile
 - NWEA Conditional Growth Index
- Reported as:
 - Scaled Score
 - Percentile Ranking norm referenced

District Update:

Ms. Monica Merritt, P-CCS Superintendent of Schools

- Ms. Merritt said she is proud of our students and how they are prepared. She
 wants our parents and students to be proud of our facilities. She is encouraging
 everyone to vote on March 10th. **turn the ballot over, this proposal is on the
 back side of the ballot.
 - On March 10, voters in the PCCS communities will be asked to consider a bond proposal for facility and site improvements, enhancing learning spaces through both remodeling and building, and upgrading technology throughout the district.

- An estimated ZERO INCREASE to the current annual debt millage rate. If the bond proposal is approved by the voters it is estimated that the annual debt millage required to repay the District's outstanding and the proposed bonds will remain at or below the current debt millage rate of 4.02 mills.

- Coronavirus concerns were discussed and Ms. Merritt said that the district is actively involved at State and County levels
 - She advised that we remind students to wash their hands often and we keep our children home when they are sick and have a fever
 - Deep cleaning is currently done and "Clorox 360 Machines" are used
 - An email will be sent out the first week of March with more communication
- As announced earlier, there will be NO boundary changes for the 20/21 school year
- Schools of Choice limited to 250 seats for K-8 grade
 - Application window begins March 12 for "out of district" students
 - Intradistrict students, wanting to apply to choose a different school, can do so beginning on March 11
