It was an exciting first week back. First I want to thank everyone for working with us throughout the week to make our new procedures for arrival and dismissal run smoothly. There are a couple of things we still need your help with.

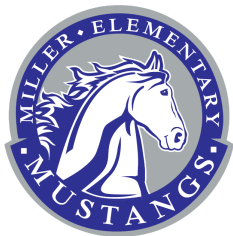
1. Supervision does not begin until 8:45/1:15 when our doors open for students to enter the building. Please do not arrive at school prior to 8:45/1:15 and if your child is walking please look at the time they are heading out of your house to make sure they are not too early.
2. In the car loop please stay in line and move forward with the entire group. We will be unloading and loading the length of the sidewalk at one time and then moving the whole group forward. Please do not pull out of the spot or drive around cars to enter the car loop.
3. All children who are meeting their parents at the front of the school by the big rock or entrance of the bus loop will exit the building out of the front main entrance. Now that we have our routines in place parents of students in grades second through fifth should stay by the rock or bus entrance to meet your children.

This coming week our schedule is a little different. First, Sunday is the end of daylight savings so be sure to set your clocks back on Sunday morning so you are ready to go Monday! On Tuesday, students do not have school due to the election. Then on Wednesday, students will log in first thing in the morning to meet with their teachers before completing asynchronous work throughout the day. On Thursday evening is our November PTO meeting. Specials Update

- Students will continue to receive an asynchronous assignment to be completed in Canvas each week; however, beginning November 2nd students will now have the opportunity to meet with their special teachers. These synchronous opportunities will be offered on a rotating schedule every other week as shown in the schedule shared by your child's classroom teacher.
- Specials' classes will be held while your child does their home portion of their learning. They will log onto Canvas at their given time each week and click on their teacher's Zoom link.

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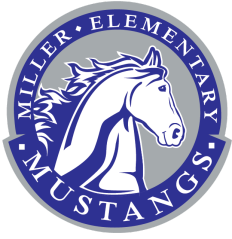

District News

- The Wayne RESA regional enhancement millage renewal is on ballot next Tuesday, Nov. 3. The original millage was passed by voters in 2016 to provide financial support for local districts faced with state budget cuts – allowing them to promote safety, prepare students for jobs and provide world-class programming for both special education and general education students. Each district in Wayne County has used the enhancement millage to improve schools in a variety of ways, including lowering class sizes, improving technology and security, adding valuable STEM and career education programs, improving facilities, and attracting talented teachers.
