## **Student Voice and Action Committee Meeting Minutes**

- 1. Meeting called to order at 1:08 pm by Dr. Vartanian-Gibbs. Attendees introduced.
- 2. The Meeting notes from June 20, 2022 were reviewed. Moved by Alex Hawkins. Seconded by Emma Jordan. The June 20, 2022 minutes were approved.
- 3. No public comments.
- 4. Committee Description
  - a. Clarified the differences between "Goals" and "Responsibilities"
  - b. Should "Creation of Budget" stay in Responsibilities?
  - c. Make sure everyone understands what Overseeing Student Environmental Data means.
    - i. Committee would look at data to give student perspective.
    - ii. Disparities to look into by students.
  - d. Came to consensus on having two equal co-chair positions.
  - e. Student would be "Honorary" member of School Board
    - i. Honorary member (which would be one of the co-chairs) would be required to attend each board meeting.
      - 1. Anyone on the Student Voice and Action Committee can attend the board meetings.
    - ii. They would be responsible for listening and offering input.
    - iii. They would make recommendations to the board.
    - iv. Legally, students cannot vote in school board votes.
    - v. Need to decide if students would give subcommittee report outs, if students would be at some parts of meetings or at whole meetings.
    - vi. Great opportunity for the student committee to add student voice to all aspects of board meetings.
  - f. Motion to have two equal co-chair positions.
    - The first year of the Committee would have two elected. One would be elected to serve a one year term; one would be elected to serve a two year term.

- ii. After that, both terms will be two years. Elections will be staggered every other year.
- iii. Subcommittee chairs will be elected from the subcommittees.
  - 1. Alex Hawkins motioned
  - 2. Nylah Brown seconded the motion.
  - 3. Motion passed.
  - 4. Secretary Anupam Chugh Sidhu explained the Roberts Rules for meetings.
- g. What will happen at SVA Meetings?
  - i. How often is it held?
  - ii. How many meetings can be missed?
  - iii. What would be expected at meetings?
  - iv. How much would be full committee vs. subcommittee meetings?
  - v. It was decided that this will be an agenda topic for the next meeting.
- h. Discussion as to what the election process for co-chairs looks like
  - i. Option for school board review applicants and then choose a pool to be voted from.
  - ii. Option for students to have the choice, and the School Board bring up possible red flags they see with the choice.
  - iii. Option for a list of experience in leadership the candidates have had. Not just school-based.
  - iv. Option for a minimum requirement of how many meetings the candidate had attended in the past. Strive for 80% attendance.
- Student Voice and Action Committee would kick off in September; elections will be held in November.
- j. Subcommittee discussion.
  - i. Option for subcommittee chair elections would happen after the co-chair elections.
  - ii. Option for all SVA members to have a vote, and the subcommittee membership would have two votes.
  - iii. Option to have two set subcommittees; rest would be rotated based on need. Subcommittees should align with the District Dynamic Plan.
- k. Document created where all ideas and notes will stay. Called "SVA Parking Lot."
- 5. Application Update and Review
  - a. Discussion of word limit for the questions.
  - b. School email will be required.
  - c. Volunteers will work on the rubric
    - i. Juhi Pawar, Shravya Ghantasala, Alex Hawkins and Jacob Jackson.
    - ii. Will work with Secretary Anupam Chugh Sidhu
  - d. Add an optional "What else do you want us to know about you?"
    - i. Want to have quality candidates.
    - ii. Don't want to limit candidates with no experience. Want to hear all the perspectives, especially the disengaged student.

- iii. Don't limit the possibilities of what students share in this section.
- e. Discussion on asking candidates about positive and negative experiences at school.
- 6. President Shawn Wilson invited students to attend board meeting on July 19 and give a report.
  - a. Juhi Pawar, Shravya Ghantasala, Emma Jordan and Alex Hawkins will attend.
  - b. President Wilson will connect with the students on the phone to discuss board meeting attendance at 1pm, July 19, 2022.

## 7. Consultant Discussion

- a. Dr. Liz Vartanian-Gibbs showed the group the responses to the important characteristics of the consultant.
- b. Divided into focus groups and discussed the document, and chose three characteristics that are most important. Groups reported this information.
  - i. Financial and budget knowledge.
  - ii. Understand what the committee charge is.
  - iii. Open minded and help committee stay on track with District Dynamic Plan
  - iv. Elevate student voices.
  - v. Leadership and advocacy experience.
  - vi. Experience with problem solving.
  - vii. Preferable for consultants to attend all meetings.
  - viii. Have connections with the community.
- c. Dr. Vartanian-Gibbs will create an RFP based on the feedback from the small groups.
- d. Legal team will review the document.
