 - g. If we are going to let some know that they are not accepted, we need to build them up. Commending them for taking the time. Optionally, give them a title as "Alternate."

 - c. 55 voting members, 13 non-voting members.
 - d. Is our goal to get as many students engaged as possible?
 - e. Is our goal to be processed based?
 - i. Which goal is best for the student?
 - ii. Want to do no harm to any student.
 - iii. Could tell students what they need to do better if they are "no."

 - b. All students in

 - ii. This can be done in the future
