Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Merritt congratulated **Hawanya Urquhart**, Liberty Middle School Teacher, who was recently named English Middle School Teacher of the Year by the Michigan Council of

Teachers of English (MCTE). She also congratulated **Daniel Parsons**, Liberty Middle School Teacher, who was named to the 2023-2024 Michigan Teacher Leadership Collaborative. This highly selective program requires teachers to complete a multiround application and interview process with only 18 educators from around the state named to this year's collective.

Canton High School was named to the College Board's annual AP Honor Roll. Based on the collaborative nature of P-CEP's AP classes, this recognition is an indication of the quality of advanced learning opportunities park-wide. Congratulations were also in order to 37 P-CEP students who were recently named semi-finalists in the annual National Merit Scholarship Competition.
